

5 TYPES OF INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAMS



VILLAGE/TOWNSHIP

A group of officers from neighboring departments who serve as first responders to incidents and generally manage the first 6-12 hours of a major or complex incident. (We don't have townships in RBC, so we start at the next level, which is ...

CITY/COUNTY/FIRE DISTRICT

A team of fire, EMS, and law enforcement officers, typically within one city or county, activated when necessary to manage a major or complex incident during the first 6-12 hours and possibly transition to a Type 3 team



MULTIPLE AGENCIES

Generally consists of multiple responding agencies in the same state or region who coordinate resources and work together. Logistics of the who/what/wear and how are specific to each state



NATIONAL & STATE

Operate through interagency cooperation of federal, state/local, land and emergency management groups. Highly trained and fed/state certified. There are 35 Type 2 IMTs in the U.S.



NATIONAL & STATE

Most robust team, operate through interagency cooperation and are fed/state certified with the most training and experience. There are 16 Type 1 IMTs in the U.S.
