The proposed Wasatch G injection zone in the PICEANCE CREEK UNIT # T35X-11G1 does not currently serve as sources of drinking water. **ORDINANCE NO. 1**  
(Series of 2024)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF DINOSAUR, COLORADO, SETTING FORTH THE COMPENSATION TO BE PAID TO THE MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF DINOSAUR AND MEMBERS OF THE DINOSAUR TOWN COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Section 31-4-301(4), C.R.S., requires that the compensation paid to the Mayor and to members of the governing body of statutory towns be fixed by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Section 31-4-405, C.R.S., provides that the emoluments of any member of the governing body of any city or town shall not be increased or diminished during the term of office for which he/she has been elected or appointed except in the case of abolition of an office; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Dinosaur, Colorado finds and determines that the compensation paid to the Mayor and Town Council members should be revised as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF DINOSAUR, COLORADO:

**Section 1.** That Chapter 2.02 of the Dinosaur Municipal Code is hereby amended to include the following additional Section:

**2.02.030 Compensation.**

A. The Mayor of the Town of Dinosaur shall receive compensation in the amount of \$150.00 per month. Town Council members shall each receive compensation in the amount of \$100.00 per month.

B. The compensation provided for in this Section shall become immediately effective upon the effective date of the Ordinance adopting this Section. Provided, however, the revised compensation set forth in this Section shall not apply to any member of the Town Council and the Mayor during the term for which he/she has been elected or appointed. Any member of the Town Council, including the Mayor, shall continue to receive compensation as previously provided by Town Ordinance through the end of the term for which he or she has been elected.

**Section 2.** That Section 2.02.030 entitled Town Council, Mayor-Vacancies is renumbered to Section 2.02.040.
